I would like to congratulate everyone who has received rewards this term and I look forward to seeing what our wonderful students will achieve in the Summer Term.



Geography

The Geography Department would like to congratulate Anna G, Class 7R3, for going above and beyond in her research into SUDs. Here is her report:

I wanted to share something exciting with you from our recent geography class. Remember when we delved into Sustainable Urban Drainage Systems (SUDS)? Well, I was so inspired by it that I decided to tackle the extension task from the workbook.

I came up with this idea that I'm quite excited about! Imagine a flowerpot elegantly connected to a drainpipe, adorned with colourful flowers cascading out of it, all neatly attached to a wall. It's like blending urban infrastructure with nature's beauty!

Here's a brief rundown of how I envision it working:

1. Rainwater Collection:

Instead of letting rainwater runoff, the flowerpot collects it, reducing the risk of flooding and making efficient use of this precious resource.

2. Natural Filtration:

As the water flows through the flowerpot and soil, it undergoes natural filtration, purifying it before it enters the drainage system.

3. Water Conservation:

The plants in the flowerpot absorb excess water, minimizing wastage and contributing to water conservation efforts.

4. Aesthetic Appeal:

Beyond functionality, the sight of blooming flowers against an urban backdrop adds a touch of serenity and charm to the surroundings.

5. Ecological Impact:

By attracting pollinators and enhancing biodiversity, this design fosters a healthier urban ecosystem, promoting harmony between city life and nature. Media and Film Studies Year 9 Media Studies

Year 9s are currently working on an exam component on music video, with a particular focus on the exam set text – the video for the Taylor Swift song 'The Man' and how gender is represented in the video, some excellent analysis and contributions from a range of students, especially Claudia W. They've also recently completed an introductory unit to practical production to provide them with the skills they will need to complete their coursework project in Years 10 and 11, with some particularly excellent work by Millie K. There were also some excellent results from February assessments, with Tiann L and Dionne M getting over 80% and Raisa B, Summer C, Jean F and Sophia H all scoring above 60%.

Year 10 Media Studies

Year 10 have completed a unit on video games and are now studying newspapers. We've covered the political allegiances of British newspapers and a range of other issues including press regulation and the differences between different types of newspapers. Year 10 are working incredibly hard and with real maturity, I've been hugely impressed by their detailed and thorough work – so much so that I'm using their booklets as examples to other GCSE Media Studies classes! There's been a huge amount of hard work from so many students. Imogen Laing has produced excellent analytical work. As with Year 9, students' hard work really paid

off in the last assessment, with Imogen, Kamira H, Daisy L, Olivia R, Larena L and Wren S all achieving 75% or above and so many other students meeting or exceeding their target grades.

Year 11 Media Studies

Year 11 have recently completed exam units on British television comedy and music promotion and are now revising for their exams. They have recently completed their final coursework projects, with some excellent work from Aysha F, Alana T and Mariem O. There were some excellent performances from students in their most recent assessments, with the vast majority of students achieving scores that met or exceeded their target grades. Aysha F, Marie G, Keila L, Mariam O, Jemima T and Alana T did especially well.

Year 12 Film Studies



Year 12 Film students are working very hard. So far they've completed units on contemporary American film, American film from 1930-1990 and are currently working on a British film unit. They've studied films including Jordan Peele's "Get Out" and Jonathan Glazer's "Under the Skin". Their film analysis and essay writing skills are developing well, with Lucy B producing particularly impressive analytical work. Students are also working on filming and editing short films that they are using to develop their production skills in preparation for their major coursework projects. Additionally, Year 12 Film student Violet C has taken up the department's suggestion that students should apply



for the BFI's Future Film Programme. This is an event run by the British Film Institute every year that introduces young people to working in the film industry. Competition for places is always high, but Violet is the latest in a line of A Level Film students from CHSG to secure a place with the BFI. Violet spent time working with film professionals and other school age students to produce a short film. Through the contacts she developed through Future Film she has been invited to be a juror at a film festival in Italy in the summer!

Year 13 Film Studies

Year 13 Film Studies students have recently completed units on global film, documentary filmmaking and experimental filmmaking and are now in the process of revising for their exams. They did very well in their last assessment, with Lucy R producing some particularly good answers. Students are also finalising their production pieces with some producing short films and others a screenplay with accompanying storyboard. There's been some very good work across the board on this but Nicole W and Abbie Z have produced some particularly good production pieces. A number of students have secured offers to study film at university, with some opting to take more academic courses and others gaining places on film and television production courses, including the very well regarded courses run by Brighton and Bournemouth universities. Who knows, in the future they may join the growing number of CHSG alumni working in the film and television industries!

Music

CHSG students have continued to work hard in their Music lessons in the Spring term and have produced some excellent work. Year 8 wrote their own raps and we have some very creative lyrics and Year 7 have been developing their keyboard technique as they learn to play 'In the Hall of the Mountain King'.
